



## Which Symbol?

Put in the missing symbols to make these number sentences correct.  
Use  $+$ ,  $-$ ,  $\times$ ,  $\div$  and  $=$ .

For example:

$$2 \square 3 = 6$$

is

$$2 \times 3 = 6$$

and

$$3 \square 5 - 2$$

is

$$3 = 5 - 2$$

Try these:

$$16 \square 18 = 34$$

$$47 \square 28 = 19$$

$$18 \square 2 = 9$$

$$30 \square 10 \times 3$$

All of the number sentences below, except two, have two solutions.  
Can you find the symbols to use?

$$51 \square 36 \square 15$$

$$45 \square 5 \square 9$$

$$27 \square 36 \square 63$$

$$70 \square 14 \square 56$$

$$7 \square 5 \square 35$$

$$50 \square 5 \square 10$$

Which two number sentences have only one answer?  
Can you see why?
